SIBU: The members of Lions clubs are urged to keep serving communities in the spirit inculcated in them by their organisations.

The founding president of Lions Club of Sibü Central Datuk Janet Lau said their services had been commendable and were recognised by the public.

"To perpetuate this spirit, the senior members should strive to pass on the legacy to the younger members," she said during "Rural Health Awareness Campaign".

The event was held at Citizen Secondary School recently by Lions Club of Sibü Central, Sarawak Vui Neng Association, Lions Club of Sibü Jaya, Lions Club of Sarikei, Lions Club of Bintangor, Lions Club of City, Women's Section of Sibü Loh's Clan Association and Sibü Chen's

Clan Association.

The current president of Lions Club of Sibü Central, Kapitan Liew Kwan Hua, who was also the organising chairman of the campaign, said that the encouraging response of the rural people to the campaign would motivate the clubs to continue with their work.

The activities held during the campaign included health screening, health talks and exhibition pertaining to AIDS, H1N1, dengue, teeth examination and extraction, eye screening, examination of glaucoma, cataract screening, drug awareness exhibition, anti-smoking campaign and blood donation.

There was also a training camp for primary school pupils who intended to enrol in Citizens Secondary School, one of five Chinese private secondary schools in Sibü, next year.

Those participating in the camp were given stationery and exercise books.
